




UNITED STATES MASTERS CRICKET ASSOCIATION Mission Statement

The USMCA got started in November 2018 immediately after the collapse of the prior tournament "Michael Holding Masters".

The US Group of Club Managers formed the USMCA Organization with a view to continue staging the annual masters' cricket tournament in Jamaica. Dr. Donavon Bennett, the first Vice-President of Jamaica Cricket Association (JCA) and Chairman of CWI's Medical Advisory Committee was approached to use his name for the tournament. He accepted and we were honored to have a world class cricket administrator on board. The USMCA gave its wholehearted endorsement in naming this senior cricket competition as "Dr. Donovan Bennett Masters Cricket Tournament". Dr. Bennett's contribution to the development and successes in cricket over some five decades is immeasurable and deserves to be celebrated.

The organization, through a select Steering Committee, develop an organizational structure, mission statement and constitution for the purpose of organizing and staging the annual Dr. Donavon Bennett Masters' Cricket Tournament. The USMCA was fully functional by January 2019, and our first tournament was held in October 2019.

In coordination with our Jamaican counterparts, our primary mission is to promote sports tourism to various communities throughout Jamaica annually, along with our young scholars' program, providing scholarships to many young primary school cricketers making transition to high school.





- > Won Thirteen (13) consecutive matches outright in the Regional first-class tournament.



Playing Rules and Conditions 2024

1. Playing Conditions:

- a) Except as varied hereunder, the Laws of Cricket (2000 Code 7th Edition 2017) shall apply. All other rules must apply to the ICC T20 Playing Conditions.
- b) The result of any game that is affected by rain, bad light or any other unforeseen circumstances shall be decided by Duckworth-Lewis-Stern (DLS) calculations.
- c) All players must be at least 45 years old by the year 2023.
- d) If a player's age is questioned by the captain/manager and the opposing captain/manager fails to provide proof of age, the player becomes ineligible for the game.
- e) Any team that uses underage players shall be in default. The total points earned by the team in default in that game shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- f) Attire: Colored uniform.
- g) White balls and colored pads will be used.
- h) There shall be fifteen (15) minutes break between innings and one 5 minutes drinks break per innings.

2. Match Points:

a)	Win	3.0 Points
b)	Tie	1.5 Points
c)	Draw	1.0 Point
d)	Loss	0.0 Point

3. Power Play (PP) Bonus Points:

a) Team scoring Highest Runs Per Over in PP	1 Point
b) Team with Highest Wicket(s) Per Over in PP	1 Point
c) If Runs Per Over are tied in PP	0.5 Point
d) If Wicket(s) Per Over are tied in PP	0.5 Point

Note:

- 1) If Team B bats second and surpassed Team A total runs scored but batted less than PP overs due to weather condition, Team B gain 1 Bonus Point.
- 2) If Team B bowls second and surpassed Team A total wickets but bowled less than PP overs due to weather condition, Team B gain 1 Bonus Point.
- **4. Completed Game:** For a result to be achieved the minimum number of overs per innings shall be five (5) unless Team-1 (team batting first) is all out in less than five (5) overs or Team-2 (team batting second) has surpassed Team-1 total in less than five (5) overs.
- 5. No-Result Game: Run rate is not applicable in a match declared as "NO RESULT".
- **6.** Late Start: Grace period of 30 minutes, after which over reduction of 5 minutes per over shall apply.

7. Team Structure & Players:

a) Each team must consist of a minimum of nine (9) players who reside in the home country of the team, and a maximum of two (2) guest players who reside outside the home country of the team.

- b) Teams can register a maximum of two (2) Overseas (OS) players.
- c) To be eligible for Play-Off games, all players must play (not 12th man) a minimum of one (1) preliminary game.
- d) It is the responsibility of Team Managers and Captains to ensure all players meet the age requirement.
- e) Government issued ID with Photograph is the Acceptable form of ID required.
- **8. Preliminary Rounds Tie Breaker:** If two or more teams are tied on points at the end of the Preliminary Rounds, their final position shall be based on the **Highest Net Run Rate**.
- **9. Ground Preparation:** Home teams are responsible for the preparation of grounds. If a team fails to prepare the ground the following shall apply:
 - a) The home team shall lose the points.
 - b) If a double header was schedule for that venue the other two teams shall be rescheduled to play on an off day.
 - c) The Executive Committee shall consider Suspension/Expulsion from future tournaments for the negligent team.
- 10. Play-off Tie Breaker: If a game ends In a Tie, the winner shall be based on:
 - a) Most Points from the Power Play (PP) during the match.
 - b) Most runs scored from boundaries during the match.
 - c) Most Points from the Preliminary Rounds, Or
 - d) Highest Net Run Rate from the Preliminary Rounds.
- **11. Play-off No Result Game**: If a game ends as a No-Result due to weather or other external factors, the winner shall be based on:
 - a) Most Points from the Preliminary Rounds, Or
 - b) Highest Net Run Rate from the Preliminary Rounds.
- **12.** Teams named first are responsible for food and refreshments.
- **13.** Clubs hosting the play-off games are responsible for food and refreshments.
- 14. Tournament Prizes and awards:
 - A) Best Batter (Local and Overseas)
 - B) Best Bowler (Local and Overseas)
 - C) Best Wicket Keeper (Local and Overseas)




